Republican Congressman Michael McCaul (Congressional District 10) represents most of Burleson County except voting precincts 203 (Cooks Point), 207 (Tunis), 211(Snook), 215 (Beaver Creek), and 412 (Clay) which are represented by Democrat Chet Edwards (Congressional District 17). The Congressional District that you are in is shown on this letter's mailing label as either CD 10 (McCaul) or CD 17 (Edwards).

Those of you voting in Cooks Point, Tunis, Snook, Beaver Creek, and Clay will want to pay close attention to the election in 2010. Democrat Chet Edwards has been perceived to be conservative in the past, but since he was touted to be a possible vice presidential candidate by liberal Barack Obama, and delighted by that possibility, we are learning more of the truth. It is said you cannot serve two masters. Does Edwards represent his overwhelmingly conservative district or does he serve his liberal leadership in Washington, D.C.? Many of his votes indicate he has forgotten his conservative constituents.

In the 2008 General Election the Republican candidate for Congress District 17 came within only 4.5% of unseating the 18-year incumbent Edwards. Edwards is vulnerable in this conservative district that extends from the city of Burleson just south of Ft. Worth to Grimes County. We have several good Republicans who have announced they will run for the nomination in the Primary election next March.
